Household Alternatives

Environmental responsibility starts in the home. These basic household items are 'essentials' for every household. They have innumerable uses, are cost effective, easily accessible (from supermarket/garden) safe to use, and very environmentally friendly!

Item	Uses	Location
Vinegar	White: cleaning, disinfecting, deodorising, anti-bacterial agent, culinary, insect repellent, preservative Cider: hair conditioner, skin astringent, personal deodorant, therapeutic uses	Supermarket (Tip: Cheaper if purchased in bulk. Use cheaper vinegar for cleaning & expensive cider vinegar for personal use).
Bicarb Soda	abrasive cleaner, deodoriser, whitener, stain removal	Supermarket (Tip: It's much cheaper from bulk supply stores).
Pure Soap (bar of soap)	cleaning/cleaning products, personal cleaning, garden spray (insect repellent), deodorising, general household use	Most retail outlets (Tip: Any bar of soap will do. Choose soap that best suites you & your budget)
Oatmeal	mild abrasive cleaner, skin care & cleanser, water softener, culinary, hair-care, chemical free soap alternative	Supermarket or Health-shop (Tip: Grind rolled oats in food-processor)
Herbs (examples: rosemary, thyme, sage, parsley, lavender)	skin care, hair care, personal deodorant, general deodorising, oral care, cleaning, mild disinfectant, insect repellent	Garden, Supermarket, Greengrocer
Rice-flour	personal care products, talc alternative	Supermarket
Eucalyptus Oil	stain removal, deodorising, disinfecting, cleaning, therapeutic, insect repellent	Supermarket Health-food shop
Beeswax - Honey	emulsifying/healing agent (for skin creams & products), sealant, preservative, polish. therapeutic	Honey: Supermarket. Beeswax: Beekeepers or Specialty shops
Lemons	mild bleach, cleaning, deodorising, skin care, hair care, disinfectant, culinary, insect repellent, therapeutic	Supermarket (Tip: Only practical if you have a lemon tree)
Salt	abrasive cleaner, disinfectant, soot remover	Supermarket

Why use alternatives?

- 2. Better for the environment less chemical residue, less containers, reduces use of Earth's resources
